Qualifications for Chaplains

ECCLESIASTICAL

- 1. Must be a licensed or ordained minister, depending upon the custom of their denomination or religious group.
- 2. Must have a clear association with, be a member in good standing within, and have a recommendation from a local church or ecclesiastical body.
- 3. Must have had at least three years experience as a minister, or as a licensed pastoral counselor.
- 4. Be recommended by an official of the field of chaplaincy you will be working in.
- 5. Display moral, ethical, and spiritual standing to justify your position as chaplain.
- 6. Must agree to, and follow th4e ethical canons of the I.C.P.C.

DEPARTMENTAL

- 1. Must pass a background investigation.
- 2. Must have a valid driver license for the State in which he/she resides.
- 3. Must pass a polygraph administered by an individual chosen by the agency.
- 4. Have at least two references from members of the local community.
- 5. Must have at least twenty hours of departmentally approved training and at least ten hours of supervised training in the field.
- 6. Have been certified by either I.C.P.C., P.O.S.T., or another similar chaplaincy conference, fellowship, or organization.
- 7. Must be willing to conform to the authority and procedures of the department or agency or chaplaincy organization to which they will serve.

EDUCATIONAL

- 1. Have a college degree of no less than two years or the equivalent.
- 2. Indicate a willingness to be involved in training that would enhance one's efficiency in meeting and dealing with people in crisis.
- 3. Be familiar with community resources and referral services.

PERSONAL/MINISTRY

- 1. Be a person of outstanding quality and integrity.
- 2. Manifest a high spiritual and moral standard.
- 3. Manifest a broad base of experience and professional maturity, emotional stability, and personal

flexibility.

- 4. Show godly compassion, understanding and love for fellow men/women, and can relate easily to people.
- 5. Be tactful and considerate in his/her approach to all people, regardless of their race, creed, religion, or lack of religious beliefs.

TASK

- 1. Be willing to respond to any/all situations where his/her presence as chaplain is needed.
- 2. Respond to natural disasters and catastrophes when needed and/or called, and to respond to anyone needing assistance they discover in the natural course of daily life.
- 3. Be willing to make the services he/she provides as chaplain a high priority when on-duty.
- 4. Be willing to assist the chaplaincy and/or the agency, if necessary, to raise funds and/or support.
